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The wealth and excellence of the information provided by ethnographers working in unilineal descent societies have made possible the construction of an ideal type: the unilineal descent group cf. They constitute a series of social groups that dominate the domestic organization and the process of socialization, the use and transfer of property, the settlement of disputes, religious activities such as ancestor worship and certain political relationships.

It has also promoted new understanding of people's mediations with Westerners. Firth states that the Maori's concept of descent is based on land rights. The reasons for this tendency may possibly be related to the intimacy of the minimal group, in which, in the process of day-to-day living, the emotional ties between the members override such frictions as may arise.
